PUBLIC WORKS

Street. Westborough - APAC has completed the asphalt and concrete work and has a few areas to add backfill behind the curb and smooth out. City staff will regrade some of the five triangle medians in the area, over the years they became unlevelled, and it is difficult to know how much of that might have been caused during construction. Residents in the area mow the medians so it should make it easier.

UTILITIES

Water Production. Under the provisions of the Long Term 2 Enhanced Surface Water Treatment Rule (LT2), staff collected samples of raw (untreated) source water during June 2017 to May 2018 for analysis of E. coli concentrations. The results did not exceed the trigger level of 100 E. coli/100mL. This means there will not be a need for any of the additional treatment requirements as prescribed under the LT2 Rule at this time.

Water treated: 8,468,750 gallons Daily Avg.: 1,209,821

Water sent to town: 8,455,875 gallons Daily Avg.: 1,207,982 gallons

Lake level: 1208.1 or 19" low

River flow: 90.1cfps

River water pumped for the year: 244,758,264 gallons

Water Distribution. Central Tank Coatings, Inc. completed the cleaning and inspection of the one-million-gallon water tower, located at the round-a-bout.
