





### **City Manager**

The Wellington Land Bank completed its second full year of operations in 2024. The goal of the Land Bank is to return tax delinquent properties to productive uses benefiting the Wellington community. In 2024, the Wellington Land Bank acquired four (4) properties and disposed of three (3).

As of December 31, 2024, the Land Bank had twenty-five properties in its inventory. ## Public Works

- Public Works Staff began a new CDL training session on January 13th. We have four new staff members in the class.
- Employees from Public Works attended a Van Diest seminar in Salina last week covering vegetation management.
- We have been burning off the brush and limb pile at the Compost Site. The largest part of it has burned down but will continue to smolder the large trunks for another month or so. We try to burn when we have several days of light wind forecasted to push the smoke south or east. As we get past the first week the biggest part of the smoke is done but we also run the risk of the wind changing direction. We apologize for any inconvenience or unpleasant effects this may cause.

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## Utilities

#### **Electric Distribution**

Employees have been busy taking the Holiday Decorations down. We thank them for being out in the elements.

#### **Electric Production**

Due to the recent cold weather and the availability of resources around the region, Electric Production staff have been operating both the gas turbine generator and the steam plant.

Wellington operates and maintains a 20 MW steam plant and a 20 MW gas turbine plant. While it is often less expensive for the City to purchase power resources on the market, the power plants offer backup for the community in case of transmission grid interruptions.



#### Water Distribution

Staff replaced the chlorine booster pump, stand and several fittings troubleshooting chlorine issues. Staff has continued monitoring heaters, avoiding cold weather issues. Staff replaced a hose in the Alum pump. The river pump is still down for repairs.
