The Mitsubishi MU-2 is a Japanese high-wing, twin-engine turboprop aircraft with a pressurized cabin. It made its maiden flight in September 1963 and was produced until 1986. The MU-2 was designed to have a high cruise speed with a low landing speed. The MU-2 features 600 horsepower engines that give it a maximum cruise speed of 340 mph and a range of 1400 miles. This performance makes it an ideal mid-size commuter aircraft. The MU-2 that is in the picture is a 1973 aircraft flown in by the owner to tend to some family business.

- Aquatic Center Repairs ~ Dondlinger Construction was on site Monday ~ February 10th to mobilize and begin cutting concrete. The weather has not cooperated much since then but they are working when it allows.

Utilities

The mission of the City of Wellington Utility Departments is to provide reliable, high quality water, wastewater, and electrical power services to our customers. Department staff had a busy 2024 below are some highlights.

Electric Production - Generated 9.5 million kilowatt hours of electricity.

Electric Distribution - Repaired 83 streetlights, replaced 21 poles, and eight anchors.

Water Production - Treated 473 million gallons with peak production of 2.6 million gallons a day.

Water Distribution - Responded to over 70 main breaks, while also upgrading 50 water services and replacing 110 meter tiles.
